125 Years of Camping 2011

Across from the Isle of Bute at the Kyles of Bute on mainland Argyll is situated the small town of Tighnabruaich. It was here in Auchenlochan that the 1st Glasgow Company held its first camp in the summer of 1886.

The influences of a week together in camp or an organised holiday very often last into adult life. Richard Passmore in his book 'Thursday is Missing' reflects on his experiences of camp with the 43rd Liverpool Company (*St Cyprians Parish*) as follows – "One Officer Charlie devoted 10 days of his annual holiday to supervise the cook house. His wife and family had to make do with the rest. Charlie spoke only rarely at Bible Class though he was always there. It dawned on me that here was an example of a man who gave himself utterly for what he believed in. His example inspired me more than all the preaching I ever heard yet I would never dare tell him so; he would be heartily embarrassed, I think of him still often and always with gratitude"!

Camping and residentials in 2011 will take many different forms and will unlikely be of ten days duration! It might be for the younger members that modern innovation 'The Sleepover'. It is possible that such experiences may well be rewarded by a commemorative badge in 2011 – but as for Richard Passmore it could be a life changing experience.

As we constantly struggle to express our Christian lifestyle in words let us remember, it just might be that our actions speak louder than words.

Ben was obliged to raise some £2,500 to fund his trip and expresses gratitude for a £100 grant from the Districts 'Dr Royds Fund'.
