# JUMBLE SALE



#### COMPANY SPOTLIGHT 1ST CHAPEL-EN-LE-FRITH COMPANY

The 1st Chapel en-le-Frith Company, The Boys' Life Brigade was enrolled on the 19th September 1926 in the schoolrooms of Town End Methodist church. Twelve days later the Boys' Life Brigade merged with The Boys' Brigade to form The Boys' Brigade we know today. It was probably one of the final Boys' Life Brigade Companies to be formed. Captain Harry Minshull and Warrant Officer Edward Carrington enrolled thirteen Boys on that night. Harry had been a member of the 62nd Manchester BB Company (Stanley Street, Openshaw) as a Boy and later joined and became Captain of 1st Alfreton Company before moving to Chapel.

The Drum and Bugle Band was formed about a year later and the practices were so unpopular with the local residents that the Captain ended up taking Boys to a quarry near Ford Hall to play. The first camp was in 1927 at Hassop near Bakewell. Most of the Boys had never done anything like this before and to quote one of the Boys (Reg Eyre) "It was a truly wonderful experience". It soon became an annual event.

Over the next few decades, the Company grew in size and reputation with only a slight interruption to meetings due to the Second World War. Graham Harper joined in 1946, the first night back after the war, having seen a sign up in the Empress Cinema opposite the Church. He was a member and Officer for over 60 years. His brother, Ralph took over from Harry Minshull as Captain in 1966. During the 1970s the Company reached its peak (up'til now) with over 100 Boys on the register. Originally in the North Midland District and not part of a Battalion, the Company joined the North West District and Stockport Battalion in 1971. We made our first appearance at the BB show in Blackpool around this time and again in 1976 as the 'Diddy Men'. We helped form the East Cheshire Battalion in the early 70s and transferred again to Manchester Battalion in 1985.

Covid was a challenge for everyone including BB. We kept going with Zoom sessions, sometimes with only one or two Boys. Our current Captain, Peter Goddard has been in charge for 30 years this year and is only the fourth Captain in our history. Since Covid we have made a bit of a resurgence. Numbers are back up to levels around 10 years ago with around 20 Boys across the sections so as we near our Centenary in two years' time we are really confident for the future.
