






THE KINGS BADGE

SOUTHPORT AND DISTRICT BATTALION - END OF AN ERA




A dignified service to lay up the Colours of the Southport and District Battalion was held on Sunday 15th June 2025 in the Parish Church of St Philip with St Paul and Wesley.


It was most fitting that the Colours should left in the custody of St Philips since this was the home of the 1st Southport Company and of particular significance since the regular meetings of the Battalion Council had been held for many years in St Philips meeting room at 8.00pm on SUNDAY evenings well into the 2000's. Always a comparatively small Battalion but very committed to traditional BB methods and always firmly entrenched in Civic and Community Life it produced from its ranks several men for the ordained ministry and the mission field. Officers undertook many senior positions in the District and the national movement. A regular column in the weekly "Southport Visiter" appeared without fail well into the new millennium.


Some 80,000 people visit the town over four days of the UK's oldest independent flower show used to be greeted at the main gate by BB members selling the official programmes.

Good participation by all Companies in the activities such as a Football League, Drill and Band Competitions and not least a Battalion Camp, these created an esprit de corps that enabled a "small committee" to organise the Brigade Council 1984 which attracted an attendance of 856 Officers from all over the British Isles, the Church Parade to the Floral Hall consisted of 17 columns included for the first time a large column of ladies resplendent in the air stewardess style uniform! The seaside town continues to attract BB Companies from all over Britain and they will always have a welcome from what remains a staunch BB town, the two remaining Companies are in Ainsdale and Marshside.

BRIAN TAYLOR (AGED 80)

Brian was born in the post war slums of Chorlton on Medlock and further deprived when at the age of 5 his father deserted the family against this background. Brian greatly appreciated the care he received in the 71st Manchester (Oxford Hall Methodist) it was this experience he sought throughout his BB career to translate the Boys in his care. After a period on the Parents Committee of 3rd Trafford Company (Sevenways Methodist) he was invited to become an Officer in the Junior Section within a year he made Company Captain a position he was to hold for some thirty years. Brian held firmly to the Brigade Values for him like many of his generation, BB was a five days a week programme!!! plus Annual Camp the Companies excellence was apparent by their many appearances in the Blackpool Display and the important part they played in Civic life Brian undertook a six year term as President of the Manchester Battalion and was an Honorary Vice President of the North West District.
